For New Captains/Teams

- Format = Four-Ball MATCH PLAY
- 6 Regular season matches: 3 Home and 3 Away
- 16 players involved in each match
 - 8 players per Team
 - 4 four-ball matches in play
- Each four-ball match involves 1 point per hole
- + Individual match win is worth an additional 2 pts
- 80 points (4x18, + 4x2) overall in each Team match
- A majority of points (40 ½) wins the Team Match



(Rule #1) CLUB / PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

(Clubs)

- A. Must be CGA member in good standing
- D. Must have access to a regulation length golf course (Type 1 Clubs)

(Players)

- E. Must be male members of a CGA member club
- F. Must be an amateur golfer (see exception M.)
- G. MUST be listed on the CLUB's (GHIN handicap) ROSTER
- H. MUST have 20 posted scores on GHIN past 12 months
 - NO PREDATED SCORES MORE THAN A WEEK OLD WILL BE ALLOWED
 - PLAYERS MAY NOT MULTI POST SCORES TO BECOME ELIGIBLE!
- I. Must have a 12 month low index (LI). There is no maximum LI
 - 18+ (REGULAR League)
 55+ (SENIOR League)
- J. Restricted to 1 team PER LEAGUE in the current year
- K. May include club staff who are granted membership
- L. May include up to 1 (one) non-amateur player (from Pro Staff or Membership)



(Rule #4)

DEFINITION OF TEAM & MATCH ROSTERS

A. TEAM ROSTERS:

- No limit as to the number of eligible players listed.
- Players MUST compete in a Regular Season Match to be playoff eligible.
- Therefore, PLAYERS CANNOT BE ADDED Following your last Regular Season Match.

B. MATCH ROSTERS

- Consist of 8 competing players from each team.
- Regular season & Play-offs.



Rule #6

TEAM CAPTAINS' DUTIES

A. Create Team and Match Rosters (Golf Genius_{TM})

- Determine your team's sign-up procedure for a match
- Educate your team on format and match play rules

B. Select tees used for each match (Golf Genius™)

- Selected yardages must play to a rated set of tees
- Tee assignment must be consistent for <u>ALL</u> home matches







Rule #6 TEAM CAPTAINS' DUTIES: (cont'd)

B. SELECT TEE PLACEMENT -

- Tees must not change during season (ex; special circumstances)
- must be a CGA rated set of tees (on the clubs scorecard)
- must adhere to the following yardage guidelines related to par:

(REGULAR Competition Tees)

- ➤ □ Par 68 minimum 5600 maximum 6100
- ▶ □ Par 69 minimum 5700 maximum 6150
- ➤ □ Par 70 minimum 6000 maximum 6250
- ➤ □ Par 71 minimum 6000 maximum 6350
- ▶ □ Par 72 minimum 6000 maximum 6700

(SENIOR Competition Tees)


- ▶ □ Par 68 minimum 4950 maximum 5900
- ▶ □ Par 69 minimum 5150 maximum 6000
- ▶ □ Par 70 minimum 5300 maximum 6000
- ▶ □ Par 71 minimum 5500 maximum 6100
- ▶ □ Par 72 minimum 5600 maximum 6400

Rule #6 TEAM CAPTAINS' DUTIES: (cont'd)



D. Home team captain prints scorecards (GGтм)

Make 2 sets for each foursome





Submit match results in Golf Genius

- both captains collect scorecards
- >agree on match results
- > HOST CAPTAIN to post match results to GHIN (immediately)
 - Enter players <u>Gross</u> scores 'hole by hole'
 - ESC will be applied automatically
 - Make sure the match date is correct
 - IMPORTANT: Players should verify their Gross Score first



Rule #6 TEAM CAPTAINS' DUTIES: (cont'd)

3.3 When a Hole is Started But Player Does Not Hole Out

There are circumstances that might result in a player starting a hole but not holing out.

For example, when:

- •The result of the hole has already been decided,
- •A hole has been conceded in match play,
- •A player's partner has already posted a better score and the player picks up, or
- •A player has already reached their net double bogey limit on a specific hole.

When a player starts a hole but does not hole out for a valid reason, the player must record their most likely score or net double bogey, whichever is lower!

The most likely score is:

- •The number of strokes already taken to reach a position on a hole, plus
- •The number of strokes the player would most likely require to complete the hole from that point.
- •Plus Any penalty strokes incurred during play of the hole.



Rule #6 TEAM CAPTAINS' DUTIES: (cont'd)

3.3 When a Hole is Started But Player Does Not Hole Out

Most likely scores should be determined on any hole using the following guidelines:

If the ball lies on the putting green, and is no more than:

5 feet from the hole: Add 1 stroke to those already taken.

between 5 feet and 20 yards, add 2/3 strokes

more than 20 yards, add 3/4 strokes



NOTE: LI's, HDCP STROKES and OPPOSING PLAYER ELIGIBILITY MAY NOT BE QUESTIONED ONCE A MATCH HAS STARTED UNLESS INFORMATION GIVEN WAS DIFFERENT THAN THAT WAS APPROVED PRIOR TO THE START OF EACH MATCH.

Rule #7 PRACTICE ROUNDS

- regular season at the discretion of each club
- playoff practice rounds should be;
 - pre-arranged by both captains
 - scheduled date/time agreeable by host club
- not allowed on host course on the day of a match

WORLD HANDICAP CALCULATION Formula:

(Player's Index x Slope/113) less CR – Par



Example: From the Blue Tees, SLOPE = 134, Course Rating = 69.5, Par = 70

Chris Zeh

- 12 Month Low Index is 3.4
- Course Hdcp Calculation Formula: (<u>Index * Slope/113</u>) or 3.4* 134/113 = 4.031
- Apply the CR minus Par adjustment (69.5 -70 = .5)
- Resulting Course Handicap = 3.531 (4.031-.5)
- Apply Interclub 85% playing hdcp (85% of 3.531) = 3.001. Rounded = 3

Brandon Hood

- 12 Month Low Index is 3.9
- Course Hdcp Calculation: (Index * Slope/113) or 3.9* 134/113 = 4.624
- Apply the CR minus Par adjustment (69.5 -70 = .5)
- Resulting Course Handicap = 4.124 (4.624-.5)
- Apply Interclub 85% playing hdcp (85% of 4.124) = 3.506. Rounded = 4



CAREER ROUNDS may require PLAYING HANDICAP ADJUSTMENTS

HANDICAP ADJUSTMENTS

Exceptional Score Low Differential Hdcp Adjustment Table

- Players playing better than the low net differential table below will have their "playing handicap" adjusted prior to each match
 - -4 to -4.9 is 1 shot off their playing handicap after it is adjusted to net off of zero,
 - -5 to -6.9 is 2 shots off their playing handicap after it is adjusted to net off of zero,
 - -7 to -8.9 is 3 shots off their playing handicap after it is adjusted to net off of zero,
 - -9 to -10.9 is 4 shots and more than 11 shots is possible DQ for the remainder of the season.

NOTE:

- If the player being adjusted is the low ball in the group, add 1 to each of the other 3 players.
- Multiple Hdcp adjustments will be added together (regardless of league).
- If a player has not followed the Rules of Handicapping, the CGA will adjust any previous match scores from that player to a DQ. The full team match results will also be updated.

C. <u>Winter Rules (Preferred Lies)</u>:

- (Reference: Section 7 PREFERRED LIES (WINTER RULES) AND ADVERSE COURSE CONDITIONS in the USGA Rules of Golf).

The Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA and The R&A govern play. These Local Rules and Terms of the Competition are in effect at all CGA Interclub Competitions. See any additional Notice to Players at the states's table or announced prior to start of the round and Entry Information for modifications or additions to the following. Complete test of the Rules and Local Rules may be found in the current Official Golds to the Rules of Golf, effective January 2019.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Condition is the general penalty. RULES COMMITTEE - Tom Thorpe, Ben Payne, Rusty Harder, Jack Nance, Hogan May

LIST OF CONFORMING DRIVER HEADS — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-1.

ONE BALL RULE & GROOVES AND PUNCH MARK SPECIFICATIONS - Local

LIST OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS – Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-3. DROPPING ZONES – Players will be informed of Drop Zones, <u>If any</u>, prior to the start of play. Model Local Rule E-1.

CELL PHONES - see Interclub Manual

DOUBT as to PROCEDURE; RESOLVING RULES ISSUES DURING ROUND —
Players must not unreasonably delay play when seeking help with the Rules during

(1) <u>Deciding Issues by Agreement</u>. During a <u>round</u>, the players in a match may agree how to decide a Rules issue:

•The agreed outcome is conclusive even if it turns out to have been wrong under the Rules, so long as the players did not deliberately agree to ignore any Rule or penalty they knew applied (see Rule 1.3b(1)).

In the absence of a <u>referee</u>, if the players do not agree or have doubt about how the Rules apply, either player may request a ruling under <u>Rule 20.1b[2]</u>. (2) <u>Ruling Request Made Before Result of Match Is Final.</u> When a player wants a <u>referee</u> or the <u>Committee</u> to decide how to apply the <u>Rules</u> to the or her own play or the <u>Opponent's</u> byld, the player may make a request for a ruling. If a <u>referee</u> or the <u>Committee</u> is not available in a reasonable time, the player may make the request for a ruling by notifying the <u>opponent</u> that a later ruling will be sought when a <u>referee</u> or the <u>Committee</u> becomes available.

If a player makes a request for a ruling before the result of the match is final:

•A ruling will be given only if the request is made in time, which depends on when the player becomes aware of the facts creating the Rules issue:

•When Player Becomes Aware of the Facts Before Either Player Starts the Final Hole of the Match. When the player becomes aware of the facts, the ruling request must be made before either player makes a <u>stroke</u> to begin another hole.

•When Player Becomes Aware of the Facts During or After Completion of the Final Hole of the Match. The ruling request must be made before the result of the match is final (see Rule

•If the player does not make the request in this time, a ruling will not be given by a <u>referee</u> or the <u>Committee</u> and the result of the hole(s) in question will stand even if the Rules were applied in the wrong way.

If the player requests a ruling about an earlier hole, a ruling will be given only if all three of these apply:

•The opponent breached Rule 3.2d(1) (giving wrong number of strokes taken) or Rule 3.2d(2) (failing to tell the player about a penalty),

•The request is based on facts the player was not aware of before either player made a <u>stroke</u> to begin the hole being played or, if between holes, the hole just completed, and After becoming aware of these facts, the player makes a request for a ruling

in time (as set out above).

(3) <u>Ruling Request Made After Result of Match is Final</u>. When a player makes a request for a ruling after the result of the match is final, The <u>Committee</u> will give the player a ruling only if both of these apply:

The request is based on facts the player was not aware of before the result of the match was final, and

The <u>opponent</u> breached <u>Rule 3.2d(1)</u> (giving wrong number of strokes taken) or <u>Rule 3.2d(2)</u> (failing to tell the player about a penalty) and knew of the breach before the result of the match was final.

There is no time limit on giving such a ruling.

(4) No Right to Play Two Balls. A player who is uncertain about the right procedure in a match is not allowed to play out the hole with two balls. That procedure applies only in <u>stroke play</u> (see <u>Rule 20.1c</u>).

OUT OF BOUNDS – Defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of white stakes or fence posts, inside edge of paved roads and

beyond.

ALTERNATIVE TO STROKE and DISTANCE — When a player's ball has not been found or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance. For two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in a large area between the point where the ball is estimated to have come to rest or gone out of bounds and the edge of the fairway of the hole being played that is not nearer the hole. This option is not available if the player his a provisional ball in play or if it was virtually certain the original ball came to rest in a penalty area.

(See Rule 14.3): Model Local Rule E-5.

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS – Includes greenside fans, starting/scoring tents, and temporary CGA signage. Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-23.

INTEGRAL OBJECTS – Include cables, rods, wires or wrappings when closely attached to trees, artificial walls and pillings when located in penalty areas and bunkers, unless otherwise denoted.



LIMITING WHEN STROKE MADE FROM PUTTING GREEN MUST BE REPLAYED – Exception 2 to Rule 11.1b applies, except that when a ball played from the putting green accidentally hist the player, the club used by the player to make the stroke or an animal defined as a loose impediment (that is, worms, insects and similar animals that can be removed easily) the stroke courts and the ball must be played as it lies. Model Local Rule D-7.

BALL DEFLECTED BY POWER LINE – If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line (or lower or a wire or pole supporting a power line during the round), the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made (see Rule 14.6 for what to do). Model Local Rule E-11.

Model Local Rule 1-1 1.

IMMOVABLE DBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREEN (BALL IN GENERAL AREA CUT TO FAIRWAY HEIGHT) — Relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be taken under Rule 16.1. In addition, if the player's ball lies off the putting green and in the general area aut to fairway height and an immovable obstruction within two club-lengths of the ball intervences on the line of play, the player may take relief under Rule 16.1. Model Local Rule F-5.

RELIEF FROM AERATION HOLES — If a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole: (a) Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 15.1b (drop ball), if the ball comes to rest in another orardion hole the player may take relief again under this Local Rule. (b) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1 d [place ball]. But interference does not exist if the aeration hole have been supported by the player and the player are the player and the player's stance or, on the putting green, on the player's line of play. Model Local Rule E-4.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR – Defined by white lines. Ground under repair also includes French drains, which are trenches filled with rocks or stones and newly

RELIEF FROM SEAMS OF CUT TURF – Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-7.

YELLOW PENALTY AREAS - Defined by yellow stakes and/or lines

RED PENALTY AREAS – Defined by red stakes and/or lines and includes unmarked drainage ditches and other open water courses. Treat all penalty areas as red penalty areas unless otherwise marked.

BALL PLAYED FROM OUTSIDE RELIEF AREA WHEN TAKING BACK ON THE LINE RELIEF — There is no penalty if a ball is played from outside relief area within one club-length where it touches the ground when dropped. This applies for Back on Line relief only. Model Local Rule E-12.

RELIEF ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF RED PENALTY AREA COINCIDING WITH OUT OF BOUNDS - For a ball in a red penalty area that coincides with OB, as an estar a leife artipoton by adding one penalty stroke, the player may drop the original ball or another ball on the opposite side of the penalty area within two club lengths of a point equal distance from the hole as point where the ball last crossed the edge of penalty area on boundary side. Model Local Rule B-2.2.

REPRESENTATION OF SIDE — The side may be represented by one partner during all or any part of a round. It is not necessary for both partners to be present, for both to play on each hole. Before Any Player in Marth Starts Hole; if the partner arrives only ofter any player on either side in the match has started play of a hole, that partner is not allowed to play for the side until the next hole.

HANDICAP ALLOWANCE — All players in the Interclub will play to 85% of their 12-month U (Low Handicap Index) prior to each match calculated every Monday. The LI is automatically determined by the GHIN Handicap Index information. PACE OF PLAY - Each group is expected to keep pace with the group ahead.

SCORE POSTING — Each player who participates in an Interclub match must have a score recorded for the match played from each hole. Scores must be posted by the host captain and MUST BE ENTERED AS GROSS SCORES. The scores will automatically be adjusted based on net double bogey using player's full CH.

SCORING AND ROUND – REGULAR SEASON and PLAYOFFS: Eight (8) players for each team will compete in one of four "four-ball" matches. The host club # 1 two-man team plays the visiting club's # 1 two-man team plays the visiting club's # 1 two-man team in an 18-hole match worth 18 points followed by the #2 teams and so on. Each four ball match is playing for 1 point per hole. Therefore, in each Team match 80 points are in play. The team that wins a majority of points (40%) is determined the winner of the Team match.

WHEN COMPETITION IS FINAL — The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee.

scores nave been approved by the Commune.

ADVICE GIVER 1 in "four-ball" match play portners and their caddies (if any) may give each other advice during a round. In addition, each team may designate ONE Advice Giver who may also give advice to any team member during a match except if the advice giver is a player on the team he is not allowed to act in that role while playing in the competition (Rules of Golf 24.4b). Advice givers must be identified and made known to the opposing team prior to the start of a match. Model Local Rule H-2.

SITUATIONS NOT COVERED BY RULES — Any situation not covered by the Rules should be decided by the Committee: Considering all the circumstances, and Treating the situation in a way that is reasonable, tair and consistent with how similar situation are treated under the Rules.

CONCESSION – You may concede your opponent's next stroke, a hole or the match, but a concession is only made when it is clearly communicated.

 - if the player's ball lies off the putting green and in the general area cut to fairway height and an immovable obstruction within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play, the player may take relief under Rule 16.1.



Music on the Golf Course During Interclub Competition

Rule 4.3a(4) permits a player to use equipment to listen to audio of matters unrelated to the competition being played.

G-8 The Committee can adopt a Local Rule prohibiting the use of audio devices during a round.

NEW: Interclub Local Rule: During a <u>round</u>, a player listening to music in a manner that is distracting to others **must** turn the device off if requested.

Penalty for Breach of Local Rule – Loss of hole in match play. Penalty for second breach: **Disqualification**.

- Teams qualify based on Pod finish & record

 - Remaining spots awarded based on records
